If you wish to be evaluated for this certification, you must complete the attached evaluation form and return it to Audrey Cooper, 279 East Manitou Road, Hilton, NY 14468 with a check for \$75 (CAA member) or \$85 (non CAA member) and indicate whether you prefer Saturday or Sunday, morning or afternoon to be evaluated. In order to determine whether there continues to be enough interest in this program to incur the cost of bringing Mr. Trapani to this area, please respond before July 14. #### NDS SHOW BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER

This year's show was planned with a little bit of trepidation and uncertainty, but most people agreed it was back and better than ever!

Because we were not sure we could get a permit for our usual venue at Northampton Park, the club gratefully accepted Nicole Cable's offer to use her facility. An enormous fenced stone dust arena, sound system, and other amenities eased the burden of setting up for the show. Manicured surroundings, a warm-up area, and ample parking made the setting ideal. Adding a few vendors and a fabulous food truck (Poutine! Fried dough!) really elevated the whole experience.

We were fortunate to have Jeff Morse as our judge. Mr. Morse is the head of the Pleasure Driving Committee of the American Driving Society with many years of experience as a competitor, judge, and breeder and training of Morgan horses at his Massachusetts farm.

There were seventeen competitors. The VSE classes were the largest, while Novice Horse and Large Pony had only one entry. All of the turnouts were of the best quality, making Dee McCartney's award of the Concours d'Elegance and Nick Forysinski's recognition as Single Best Pleasure Turnout special honors. We also had three entries in the multiples division this year; a welcome sight as that class has been hard to fill for the past several years.
